MEET LINDSEY NOLAN - SPEECH THERAPIST AT HHLA



Lindsey has been a speech-language pathologist at HHLA for a little over two years now. In her role she works with children in early intervention, school and clinic settings. A native of Elizabethtown, she loves living in Louisville because there's always something fun to do or a new restaurant to try.

While I was completing my undergraduate at Western Kentucky University (she attended Campbellsville University for 2 years before transferring), I observed several different professions. "I knew my calling in life was to help others, but I didn't know in what way at the time," says Lindsey. It was when she observed a speech therapist who shared stories of non-verbal children saying "hi" for the first time with help from a hearing professional, she was hooked. "The more I looked into speech therapy, the more I knew it was the right path for me," says Lindsey. "I've always been interested in hearing loss since my mom wears hearing aids," says Lindsey. After completing her masters of science in Speech Pathology at The University of Louisville, she set her sights on a career in speech therapy and pathology. Working at Heuser Hearing with the deaf and hard of hearing has been a perfect fit for her.

According to Lindsey, the most important part of her job is educating parents to ensure carryover for the child's speech and language skills in all settings. "I've always loved working with children and I especially love hearing a child say their first word and seeing the parents' faces light up," she says. Nonetheless, the job can be challenging when trying to juggle so many different families' schedules. "I understand that families are trying to take other siblings to soccer practice or make it to all sessions so I attempt to be as flexible as possible while still serving as many children as I can," she adds.

When asked the future of hearing health and technology, Lindsey is optimistic. "Hearing technology has improved a lot in the last 5-10 years, so I foresee exponential growth in the coming 5-10 years as well," says Lindsey. She's convinced it will expand even more and as technology improves, the devices will continue to get smaller and even more advanced.
